

GENERAL HOME CARE AFTER PLASTIC SURGERY

• WOUND CARE AND HYGIENE:

- THE DOCTOR WILL REMOVE YOUR DRESSING AT THE FIRST POSTOPERATIVE APPOINTMENT.
- ONCE THE DRESSING IS REMOVED, YOU MAY CLEAN THE AREA WITH SOAP AND WATER AND PAT IT DRY.
- YOU MAY NOT BATHE OR SHOWER UNTIL INSTRUCTED TO DO SO, HOWEVER YOU MAY TAKE A SPONGE BATH.
- EXPECT SMALL AMOUNTS OF BLOOD-TINGED DRAINAGE AT THE INCISION SITE FOR 2 3 DAYS. YOU
 MAY COVER THE SITE WITH A BANDAGE.

• DIET:

- START WITH A LIGHT DIET AND PROGRESS TO A REGULAR DIET.
- ACTIVITY:
 - GENERAL LIGHT ACTIVITY AND WALKING IS ENCOURAGED, BUT DO NOT "WORK OUT" OR DO STRENUOUS ACTIVITY UNTIL AFTER YOUR FIRST DOCTOR'S VISIT. GENERALLY EXERCISE IS LIMITED FOR THE FIRST 6 WEEKS AFTER SURGERY. SEXUAL ACTIVITY MAY BE RESUMED WHEN YOU ARE COMFORTABLE.
- WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER SURGERY:
 - YOU MAY HAVE SWELLING, TENDERNESS, NUMBNESS, AND DRAINAGE AT THE SURGICAL SITE. THESE SYMPTOMS SHOULD RESOLVE SEVERAL WEEKS AFTER YOUR SURGERY.
 - SINCE EMERGENCIES ARE UNPREDICTABLE, PLEASE HAVE SOMEONE STAY WITH YOU THE FIRST 24 HOURS AFTER YOU ARE HOME.

• MEDICINES:

- TAKE YOUR USUAL MEDICINES AS PRESCRIBED BY YOUR PRIMARY DOCTOR.
- ASK THE DOCTOR WHEN TO RESTART ASPIRIN OR BLOOD THINNERS DAYS AFTER YOUR SURGERY.
- YOU MAY BE GIVEN A PRESCRIPTION FOR ANTIBIOTIC AND/OR PAIN MEDICINE.

• SMOKING:

- Smoking interferes and healing. Please do not smoke for 2 weeks before or after surgery. The nicotine patch or gum is also not recommended.

• CALL THE OFFICE AT IF YOU HAVE:

- FEVER ABOVE 100.5 F
- EXCESSIVE PAIN
- REDNESS AT THE INCISION SITE
- DRAINAGE THAT HAS INCREASED OR CHANGED

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
